

Convention on Facilitation of International Maritime Traffic

The Convention on Facilitation of International Maritime Traffic was signed on 9/4/1965 and entered into force on 5/3/1967¹. 117 States are party to the Convention, which constitute 93.78 % of the gross tonnage of the world's merchant fleets².

The assent for the Republic of Turkey's accession to the Convention on Facilitation of International Maritime Traffic has been granted via the Act dated: 8/4/2014 No: 6430 (OG dated 16/4/2014, No: 28974). Subsequently the accession has been promulgated³ by Board of Ministers on 1/2/2016, following the post of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs dated 6/1/2016 No: 10261832. The instrument of accession has been deposited on the date of 13/5/2016⁴. International Convention has entered into force for Turkey on 12/7/2016⁵.
